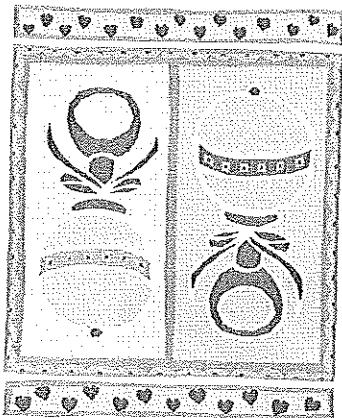

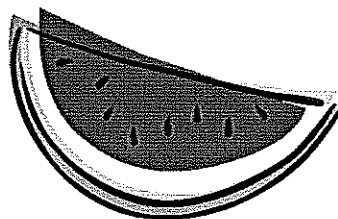


## Preschool News

## School Age News

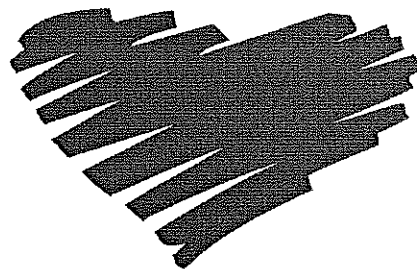
